Official School Shirts



Official School Shirts include those of clubs and organizations directly affiliated with Whittier Elementary, where membership or participation is available to all students, or all students of a particular grade level.

Socks and tights should also be of a solid dress code color.

Logos are permitted but must be small and fit under a quarter dollar coin.

Decorations must be the same solid color as the article of clothing. (Dyed to match)



# Whittier Elementary School Dress Code



**Our Dress Code**

Students, teachers, and staff are expected to dress in a manner that demonstrates they respect themselves and the learning environment. Clothing should be neat, clean, and appropriate for learning and weather conditions. It should not draw inappropriate attention to the wearer, nor disrupt the learning environment. If clothing is distracting to teachers or students, such clothing is unacceptable. Staff will determine when an individual student is in violation of the dress code. Appeals of staff decisions may be referred to the School Community Council.

Please be aware that teachers encourage students to comply with the dress code but no child will be excluded from class or punished in any way for being out of compliance. If your child is unable to be in dress code compliant clothing occasionally, please just call or send a note to the teacher.

We have a supply of Dress Code Compliant clothing in the office. Students that are not in compliance are sent to the office to change and are changed back into their own clothing at the end of the day.

Students are expected to be in dress code compliant colors and clothing when they attend our school. Our dress code policy was designed to be as easy and inexpensive as possible for parents. As you purchase new school clothing for students, please keep our dress code colors in mind. Should you have need of additional clothing to keep your child/ren in regular compliance, please see our school counselor

## **Do's and Don'ts at Whittier**

No stripes, or patterns on clothing.  
Logos must be small and fit under the size of a quarter dollar coin.  
No Blue Jeans (Levis).  
No bandanas worn with clothing or in hair.  
Tights and socks should be of one solid dress code color.  
Layered clothing (including undershirts) must also be in uniform colors.

*Absolutely nothing will be allowed at school that is intended, recognized, or acknowledged by the Salt Lake Area Gang Task Force, to signify affiliation with, participation in, or approval of a gang. This includes any article of clothing, badge, symbol/emblem, sign/lettering, hairdo, jewelry, eight-ball design, tattoo (including those drawn with a pen), body paint, or excessive make-up or face glitter.*

## **The following is also considered to be in violation of the dress code:**

- Garments that are low enough to reveal a student's underwear
- Clothing advertising drugs, alcohol, tobacco, acts of violence or lawlessness
- Clothing associated with gangs, illicit drugs, or illegal substances,
- Clothing with offensive and/or vulgar language and/or designs
- Clothing which calls attention to the body, including bike pants, spandex, unitard knit tights, body suits, sheer clothing or skin tight clothing
- Hats, caps, or hoods worn in the building
- Clothing with intentional cuts, slashes, fraying, or holes
- Short shorts, running shorts, or mini skirts (as a rule of measurement, shorts hem should reach the finger tips when arms are held loosely at the side)
- Crop tops showing midriffs, tube or tank tops or halters
- Belt tails that dangle
- Dangling jewelry, particularly earrings
- Flip-flops
- Sunglasses worn in the building
